
# **Sports & Faith**

"Praying with your team can be a helpful way of reminding your players of God's presence on and off the playing field. Take these things into account when praying with the team:

- Prayers can be spontaneous or prepared ahead of time.
- Invite team members to lead the team in prayer.
- Pray to play well rather than to be granted a victory.
- Pray for your opponents.
- In games, invite the opposing team and officials to participate in the prayer."
